- 9 Q. -- but no indication they ever actually had any --
- 10 A. No. No, and that's -- that why I think it was wise
- 11 to presume that from a planning point of view, that the
- 12 Nova Scotia Government probably would be paying for some
- 13 coal, at least that was my opinion.
- 14 Q. Were you ever able to estimate what the cost might
- be to the Nova Scotia Government if that agreement were
- 16 implemented?
- 17 A. Well, presumably, it would be implemented pretty
- 18 close to world prices, and I think they were about \$55 a
- tonne then. So I can do the math, but I haven't.
- 20 Q. All right. In the middle of that page, he then
- 21 addresses the third concern that you had raised and that
- 22 is the justification, I quess, advanced by the Province
- 23 for the expenditures being requested, and that is that it
- 24 will lower their cost of achieving their emission
