13 sometimes to considerable detriment and that we should  
14 try to avoid that under those circumstances. In  
15 hindsight, do you not think that if you didn't originally  
16 inject the swirl of politics into this issue, that that  
17 sort of thing was part of the swirl of politics?

18 A. Mr. Merrick, how could you sit there and accuse me  
19 of injecting politics? Politics is injected in it by the  
20 process in the House. The Government --
