MR. CAMERON, EXAM. BY MR. MERRICK

- 1 I mentioned that it was possible to accomplish the same
- level of emissions from Trenton 6, the new one, by a
- judicious mixture of coal from DEVCO, mixing low-sulphur
- 4 athricite -- anthracite coal that they had with washed
- 5 higher sulphur coal. It would produce a very low-sulphur
- 6 content coal for burning. This was one of those
- 7 occasions when we had a rather difficult conversation.
- 8 And at that time he said -- and he's quoting you, "`There
- 9 is no way we are going to burn DEVCO coal in Trenton 6,
- and if we're going to get into that kind of an argument,
- 11 we'll change the SO₂ regulations.'"
- 12 Do you recall making that threat to them?
- 13 A. I don't know if I could change the SO₂ regulations,
- 14 but I recall that conversation and why it was so
- 15 upsetting. I said earlier in my opening comments about
- 16 the difficulty with the environment and Trenton, and I
- 17 remarked that by building a new plant it was going to
- 18 replace all that old equipment that didn't have any
- 19 pollution on it at all. Small units.
- 20 By building Trenton 6, we'd almost double the
- 21 sulphur emissions. And I think most people would agree
- 22 that we already had a problem with sulphur emissions.
- 23 And this was explained. I explained it to them in
- letters, that it -- you had to look at the local problem.
- 25 When you look at the overall system that they wanted
