- 1 to accept ultimate responsibility for that, how can we
- 2 ever have any assurances that things will change or
- 3 improve?
- 4 A. Well, they'll change if you -- there's been a great
- 5 effort made to update the law that was under -- operating
- 6 under at the time of this terrible disaster.
- 7 The new Minister Brown has introduced legislation. I
- 8 think he said it took three years. It's actually
- 9 something we started. It took three years, met with over
- 10 100 different groups of labour and industry. And, to me,
- 11 that's a process that is going to be better than any
- 12 other to try to protect the safety -- workers of our
- 13 province. That's how you protect the safety of our
- 14 people. A three-year process and now legislation with
- the foundation based on what all these people, including
- 16 the unions, believe is the safest way to make sure that
- 17 people in Nova Scotia are going to work in a safe
- 18 environment. And that's a law of our province. I'm not
- 19 criticizing that law. I think the Minister has made a
- 20 tremendous effort the last three years to try to bring
- 21 these results. And he certainly went out and talked to
- 22 an awful lot of people to try to deal with the issue that
- 23 we're talking about right here today. And that -- the
- 24 foundation of that, the foundation, is an internal
- 25 responsibility.
