14 over. It's a -- as someone has lost someone in an
15 accident, killed, and found that person that was very
16 close to me, I know the horrors of looking down at your
17 loved one and knowing they're dead and they're never,
18 ever going to be there again.

19 And the time it takes to get over that, the healing
20 process, the grieving process and how, after time, your
21 tears and your sorrows turn to some happiness because you
22 start remembering the times you enjoyed and the good
23 things you did.
