1 at the issue of health and safety of our workers, and
2 that was a proposal by the Minister, I'm sure Cabinet
3 wouldn't say, "We don't care about this." I don't think
4 there's anyone in the province that doesn't care about
5 the safety of the workers in the province on any side of
6 the House.

7 Q. I suspect that on a number of occasions you would
8 have signed proclamations recognizing April 28th as the
9 day of mourning for workers that are injured and killed
10 on the job while you were Premier?

11 A. Yes, I believe I did.

12 Q. And --

13 A. I signed a lot of them, though, I can tell you that.

14 Q. And you're saying that in that period of time when
15 that proclamation came in that you never heard anything
16 from the Federation of Labour saying that they were
17 concerned about the health and safety of this province?

18 A. No, Mr. Wells, I cannot recall anyone from labour
19 coming into my office when I was Premier, and it was only
20 for two and a half years, concerned about the legislation
21 or regulations. I heard after the fact that those
22 concerns were expressed to the Department, but that's
23 after the fact.
