1 it. Mr. Barker was bidding highway jobs and no one
2 seemed to be concerned about that. And I think he had
3 every right to do that. And, as a free citizen, I think
4 you have the right to bid on private work and --
5 especially private work not connected to the Government
6 in any way. And the fact that he only received three of
7 the jobs he bid on would indicate that.

8 I must also say that the late Mr. Scott Weeks was
9 concerned about this issue, and I always found Mr. Weeks
10 to be a very fine person. And I said, "Scott, I wish you
11 would go in to Curragh and ask them to see all the bids
12 to satisfy your own mind that you were treated fair."

13 And, in fact, he did that. He spent a whole
14 afternoon there. And he called me after and he said,
15 "Don, I am convinced that -- now I am convinced, after
16 looking at all the figures, that this was done on a fair
17 basis." So it's easy for people to spread rumours
18 around, but --

19 Q. And that's what we're here to do, to address them.
20 And there's another one that I want to address. It
21 related to that. Were you aware that Satellite
22 Construction had a contract to grade roadways underground
23 with a dozer? Were you aware of that?
